InET Consortium Incentive Grant

The priority of InET is to expand access to innovative educational technologies to increase the academic achievement of eligible migrant students whose education is disrupted due to frequent moves across state and international borders.

The Migrant Education Program in the 8 InET states (AZ, CO, ID, MN, NE (lead state), OR, PA and WA) will use innovative technologies to:

- Foster awareness of eligible binational migrant student needs
- Imagine, plan and design systems for services
- Create and deliver resources, materials and programs
- Improve existing infrastructures
- Produce solutions for raising student achievement
- Disseminate effective practices to the MEP community

Professional Learning

Training Modules

Electronic modules will be developed and piloted in the 8 InET states. The modules will support the academic needs of the identified binational migrant (BN) student by supporting teachers and administrators.

Cadre of Coaches

A Cadre of Coaches will be identified and trained to provide onsite technical assistance and assist in the research and development of the modules.

Professional Development

Professional development will be provided to teachers of binational migrant students using innovative educational technology.

Instructional Materials and Resources

Instructional Resources

Instructional materials and resources that use innovative technology tools for improving access to services by BN migrant students will be identified, designed, and adapted.

Effective Practices

Practices, Procedures, Protocols

Practices, procedures, and protocols are instituted in the InET states to improve the educational attainment of identified BN students and provide access to services. These include coordinated efforts between the U.S. and Mexico focusing on learning about the culture, schools, and educational systems in Mexico from which our binational students come.

Technology-Based Support

Virtual Meetings

These meetings connect state migrant directors with resources to explore and improve programs and services to BN students through innovative technology.

Website

The InET website allows states to share information, post resources and FAQs, promote the Teacher Exchange Program, and provide essential processes to support the BN student.

Electronic Lessons

InET will provide technology-based lessons and instructional materials.

Services Provided by Consortium States

Available Services and Resources

States are surveyed to determine available resources and expertise in each InET state related to existing and needed innovative technology services.

Collaboration

A formal structure is in place for joint problem-solving among Consortium states that include visioning how to use innovative educational technology.

Lessons learned and resources are shared among states to transform interstate/international coordination around the unique needs of BN students and teachers.
